General Supply List

All students will need the following general supplies by the first day of school, August 5, 2010. Please see the Class Supply Lists on the following pages for additional grade-level specific supplies needed.

- Binders
 - At least one 3-ring binder to organize their paper, handouts, and assignments
 - Most students prefer to have 2-3 binders, with each being devoted to the work for 2-3 classes.
 - Students may choose the size for their binders (1.5 – 2 inch binders are recommended).
 - Binders must be free of pop cultural depictions, sports teams, logos, messages, etc.

- Paper
 - A constant supply of loose-leaf paper to complete assignments and take notes
 - College ruled or wide ruled paper is acceptable.
 - Students may also use spiral-bound notebooks to take notes for classes.
 - Most students prefer to have 1 “single-subject” notebook per class to keep their notes organized.

- Writing Utensils
 - 2 sharpened pencils (mechanical pencils are permitted)
 - Students are encouraged to have personal pencil sharpeners as well to keep their pencils sharpened throughout each day.
 - Blue or black pen
 - Dry erase marker
 - An eraser

- Combination lock (for the locker) – keyed locks will not be permitted

Notes:

- Student planners, on which students will write their homework assignments for each course on each day, will be provided by the school at the beginning of the school year.

- Students will engage in project work in some classes that require materials such as poster board, glue sticks, colored paper, etc. While students will be given ample notice and time for work on these assignments, some families find it helpful to have such items "on hand."
